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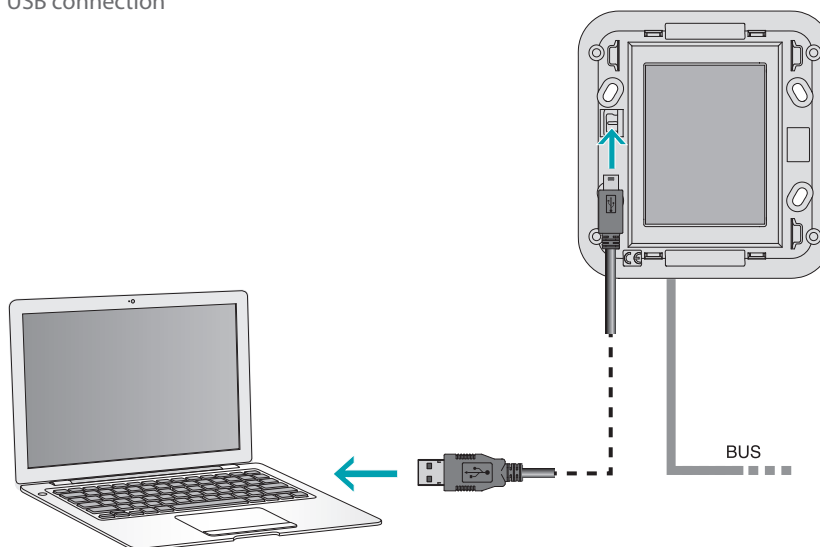

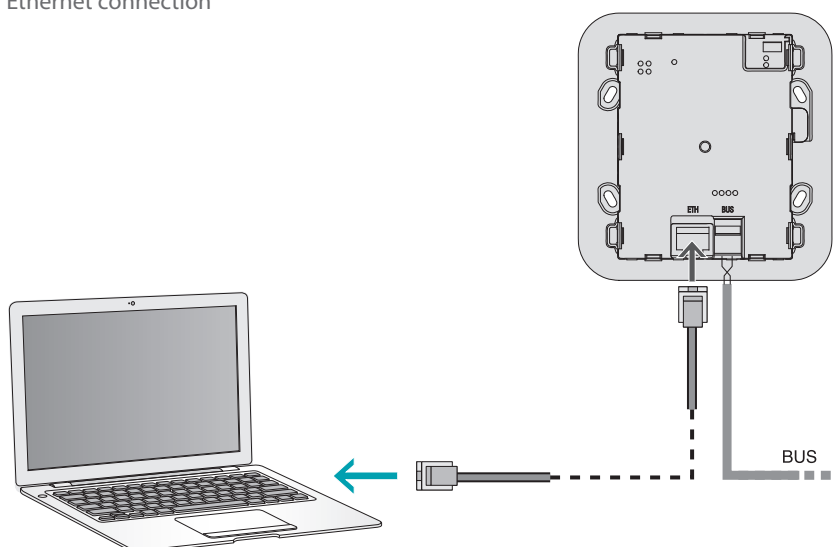
Interaction with the device

To [Send](#) or [Receive the Configuration](#), [Update the Firmware](#) and [Request Device Info](#), it is first of all necessary to connect the device to a PC, and make sure that the right port has been selected. Connect the MyHOME_Screen3,5 to the PC using a USB-miniUSB cable, or an Ethernet cable. For communication to take place, the device must be connected to the BUS.

USB connection



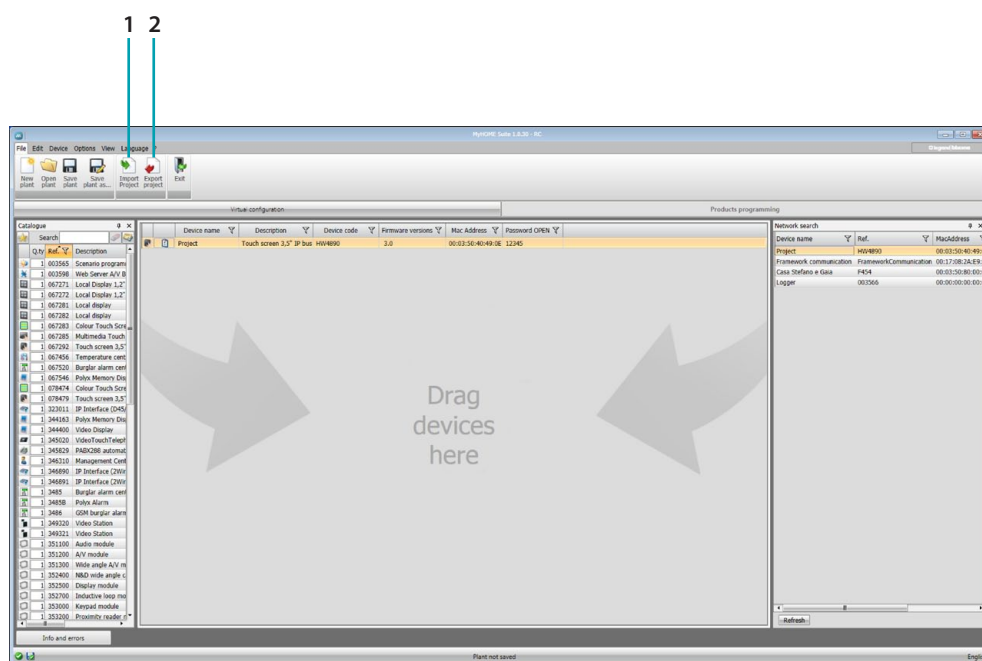

Device configuration

The device can be configured by creating a new project, or by opening and existing one, which can then be changed and resent to the device. These operation can be performed inside the global area of the software, using some dedicated device management pushbuttons:

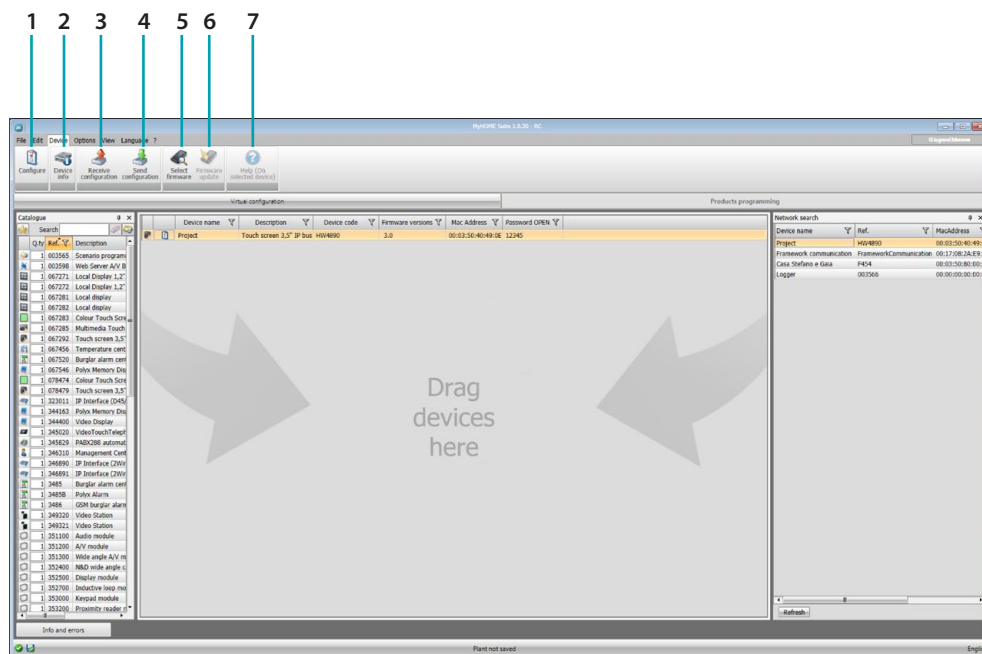

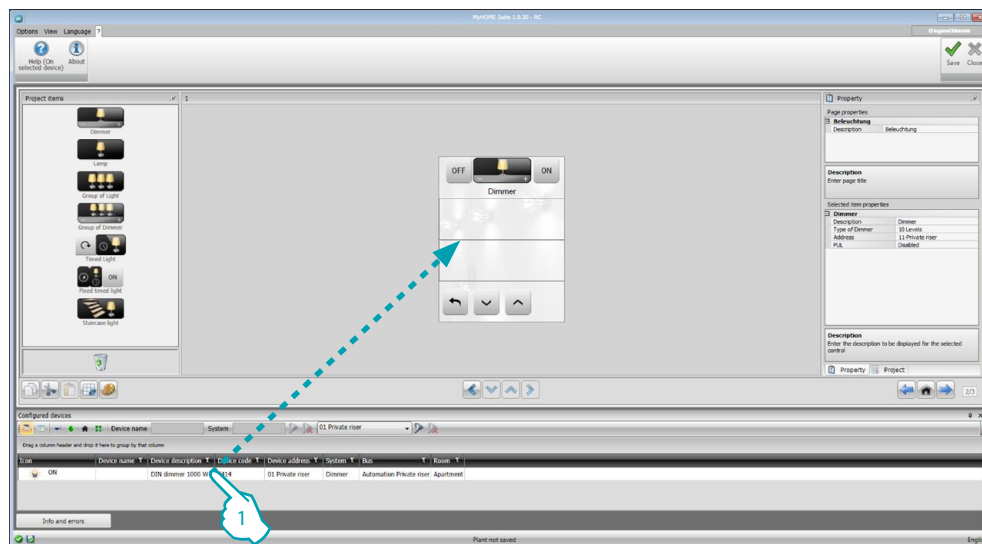

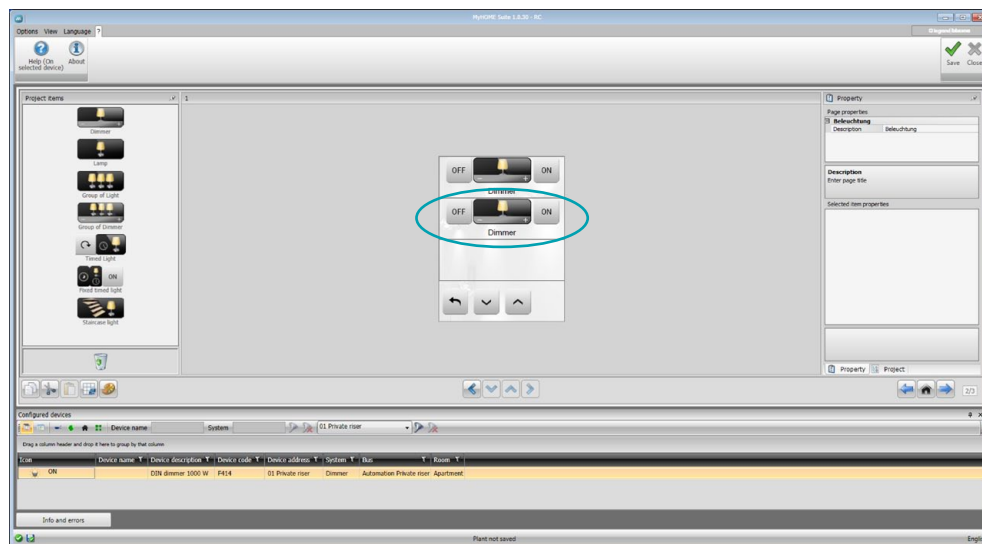

Configured objects

The objects included and configured in the global project are available in the configured objects area and can only be displayed in the system they belong to.



1. Drag the selected object inside the "Display" area of the software.



The object will now be visible in the "Display" area, and no further configuration will be necessary.

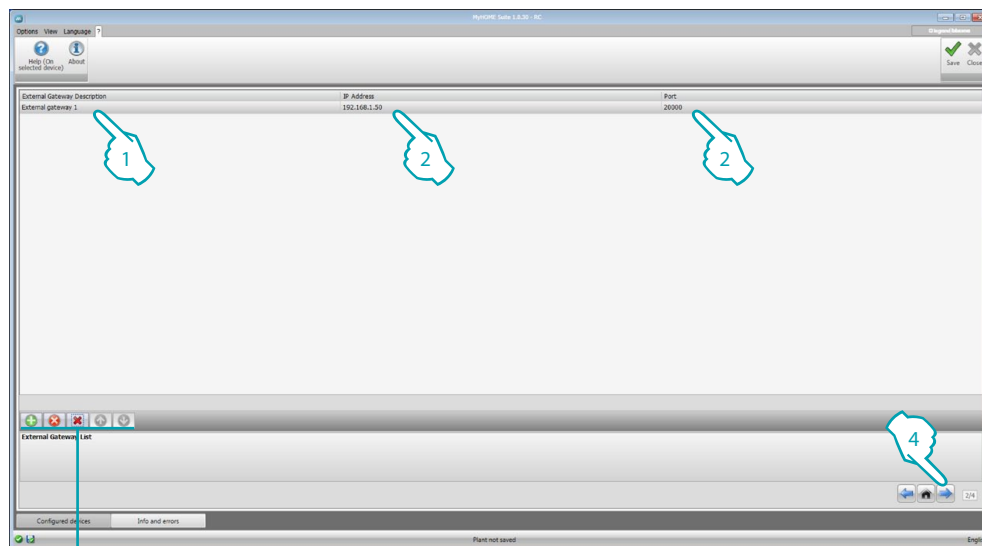
Configuration Parameters

- **General parameters, clock**
Clock alignment function: decide if MyHOME_Screen will be set as the Master clock of the My Home system
Data format: select the date format (e.g. dd.mm.yy. /mm.dd.yy. /yy.mm.dd.)
- **Temperature unit of measurement**
Temperature format: select if you wish to display the temperature in Celsius (°C) or in Fahrenheit (°F)
- **Automation**
Level: if the device is wired to the SCS BUS, select the level it belongs to (private riser/local BUS)
- **Video door entry system**
Video door entry system: select enable if the device is wired to the video door entry system BUS, select disable if it is wired to the automation BUS
IP address: if "Enable" has been selected during the configuration, enter the address of the handset associated to MyHOME_Screen
- **Multimedia**
Multimedia source address: enter the MyHOME_Screen address as sound system source (if adaptor 3456 is present)
- **Managing external Gateways**
External Gateway: enable/disable the presence of an interface towards the BACnet (F450) system
- **Default standby page**
Default standby page: select the page that appears when leaving standby. This can be the last page displayed, the Home page, or the Favorites page
- **Language**
MyHOME_Screen language: select the language that will be displayed on MyHOME_Screen

After configuring the parameters click the  pushbutton to go to the configuration of the external Gateways (if enabled).

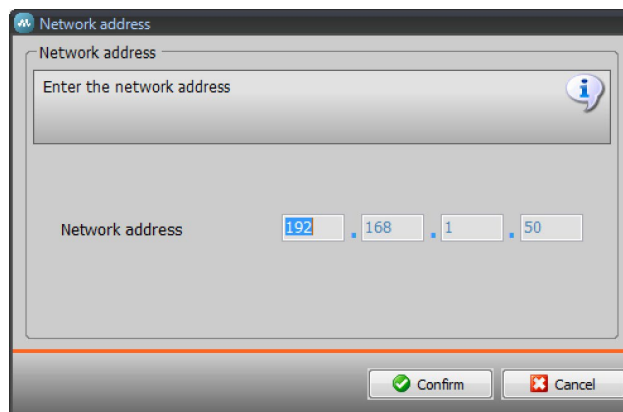
External Gateway

The setting of an external gateway, for example F450, gives the possibility of controlling the external proprietary systems using MyHOME_Screen (e.g. HVAC-Bacnet systems).

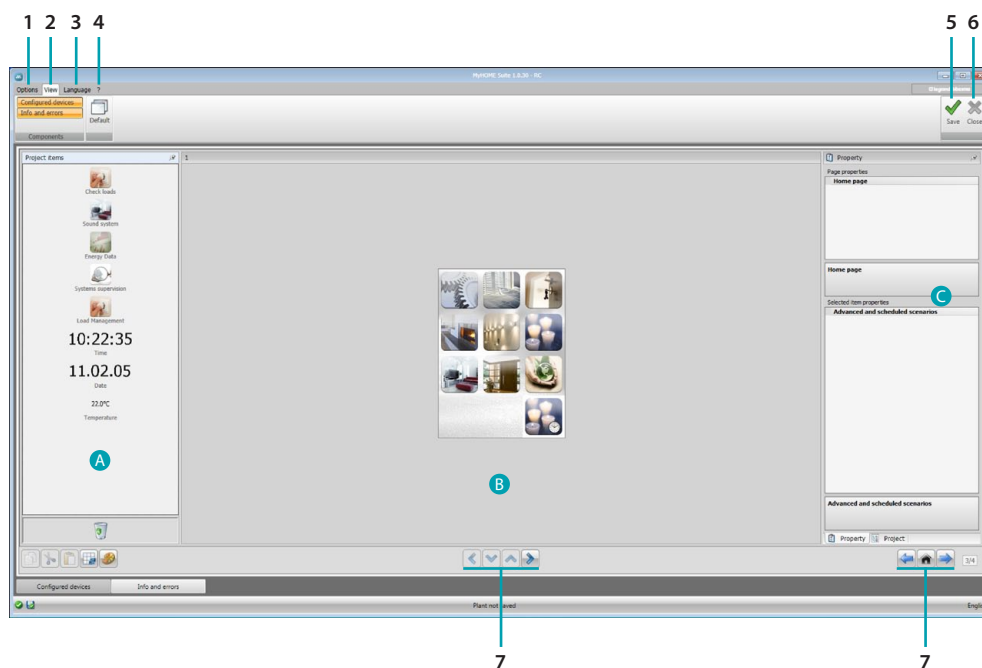

This is used to configure what will then be displayed as the Home Page of the device, and its subpages. On the right side of the screen (C) is the “Property/Project area”, which can be used to configure the object selected in the Display area.

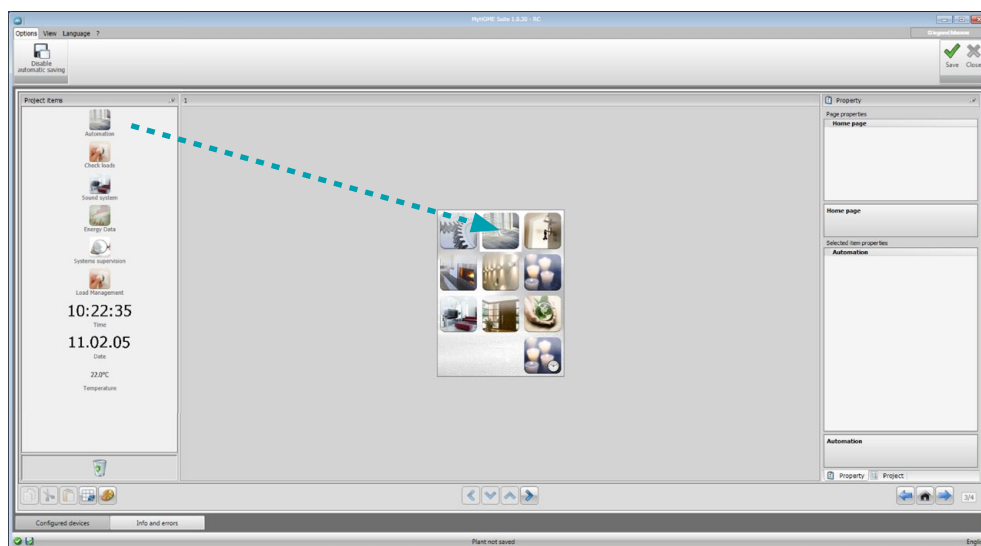

Project items

This area shows all the objects that can be used to build the pages. To do this simply drag the objects.

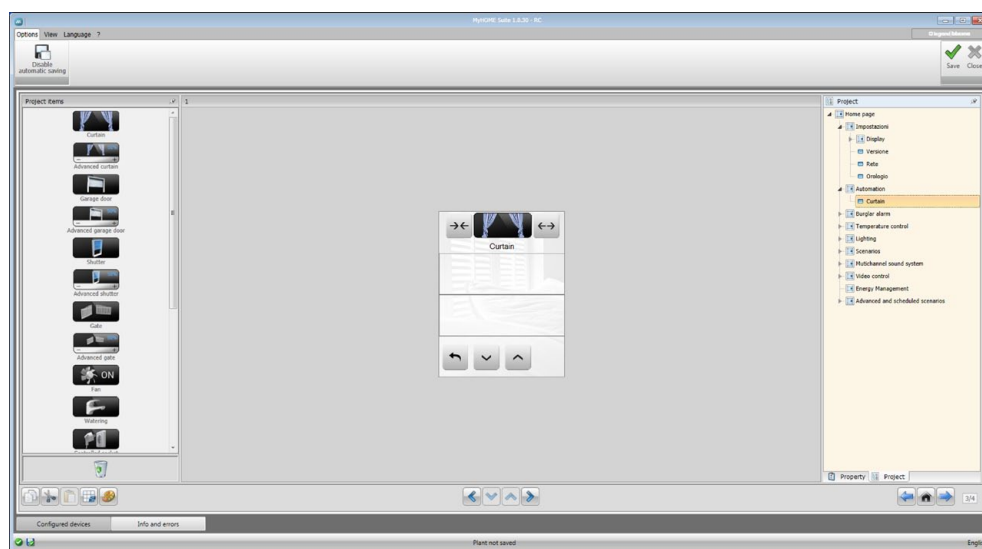


Warning: The "Energy Data", "System Supervision", and the "Load Management" functions may be included individually in the project. Alternatively, select the "Energy Management" function, which groups together the three above mentioned functions.

Sub-pages

Some objects are used for connection to other pages, where correlated objects can be grouped together (e.g. Automation).

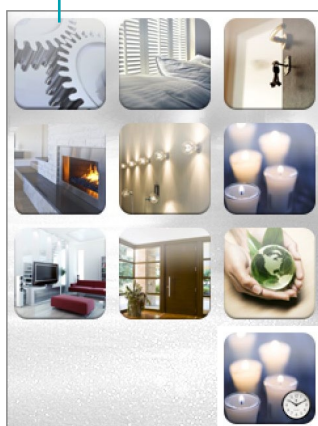
The configuration of the sub-pages is performed following the order the objects have been included in the Home Page.



Display

The "Display" area shows the future setup of the Home Page and the sub-pages of the device. This page consists of customisable objects. The "Settings" icon is the only one that cannot not be removed.

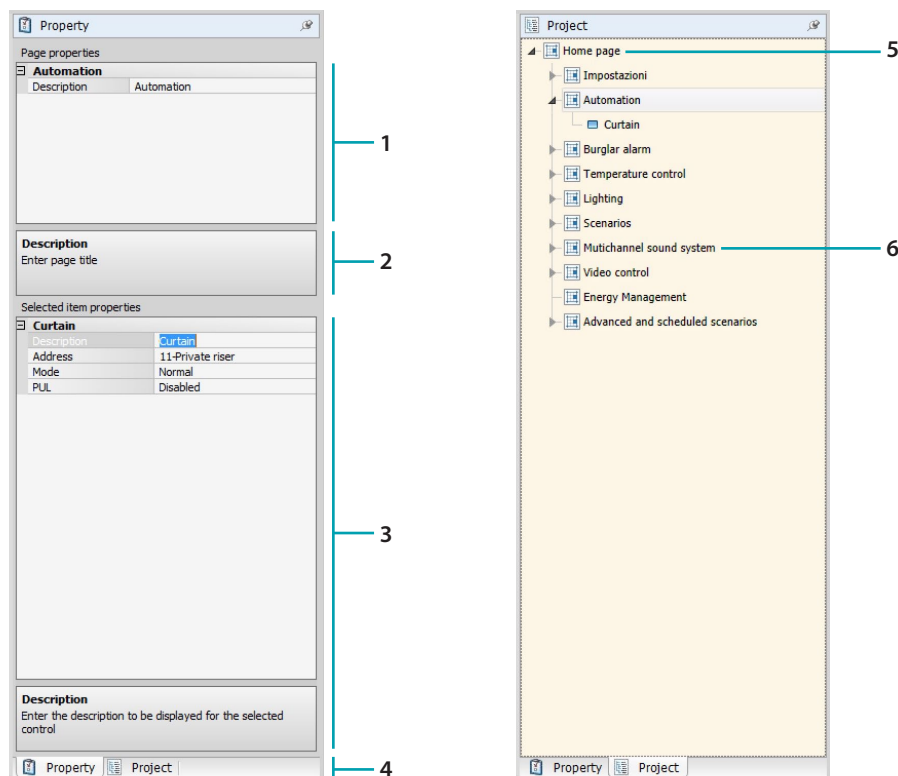

Property/Project

This area is split into two sections, which can be selected by clicking the labels at the bottom; the “Property” section shows the configuration fields for the object currently selected in the Display area.

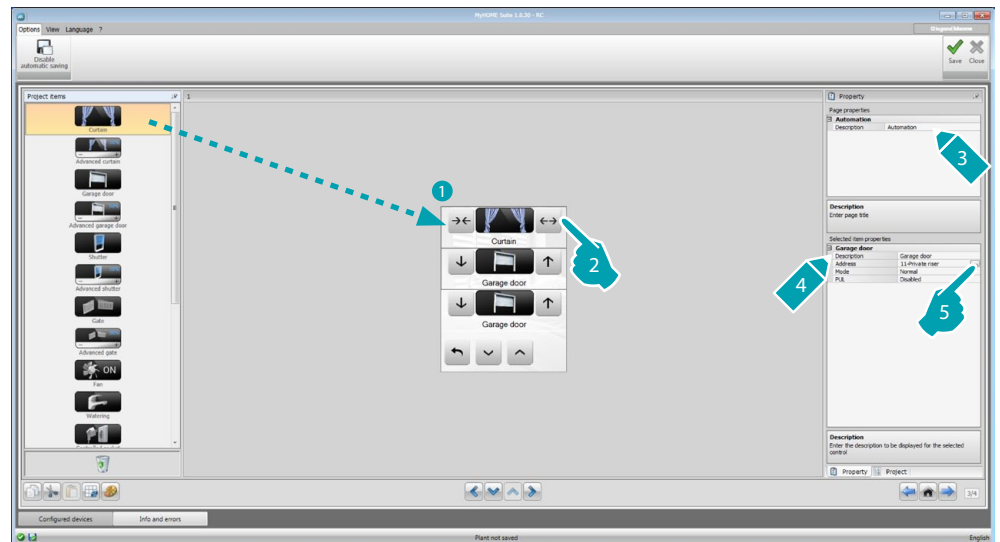
The “Project” section displays the objects by page in a tree menu format. In addition to selecting the objects, the user can also navigate through the project, selecting any available sub-pages.

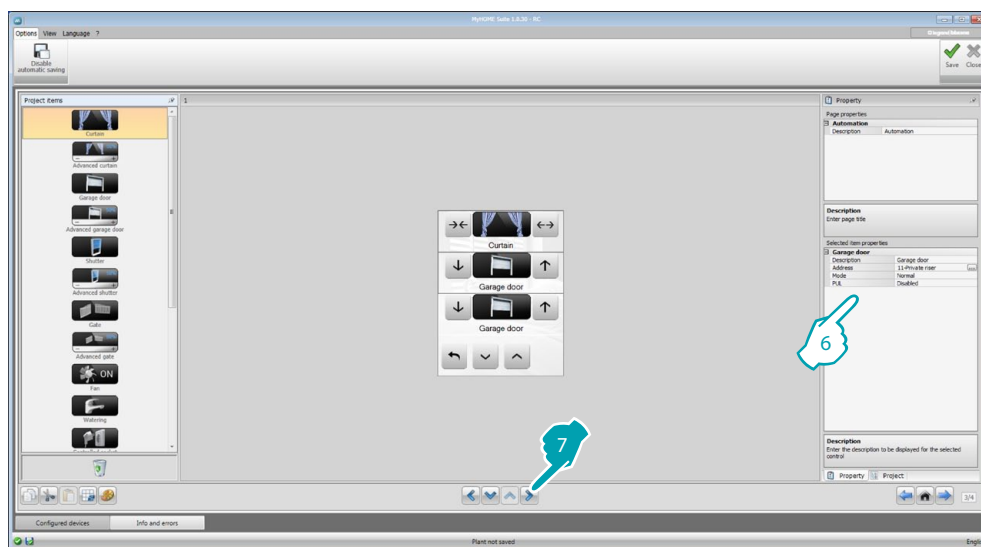
This section shows the procedures found in most of the configuration screens. These procedures are highlighted by the light blue filling of the symbols (arrows, hands, pencils).




Modifying an existing project

1. Double click or drag the function/application from the "Project items" area to the "Display" area.
2. Select a function from the "Display" area.
3. Customise the page description in the "Page Properties" area.
4. Customise the description of the selected function in the "Selected Item Properties".
5. Click to configure the address.

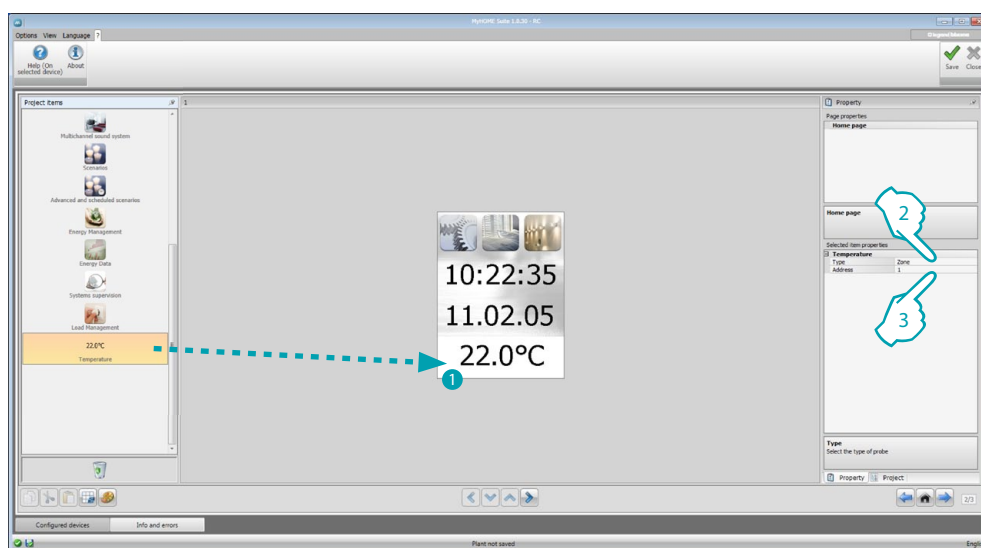
- **A = Room:** select the value of the configurator of the A room (0 - 10, GEN, AMB, GR).
- **PL = Light point:** select the value of the configurator of the PL light point (the number depends on the function).
- **Level:** select the level it belongs to (Private riser = level 3 or Local Bus = level 4).
If Level = Local Bus is selected, the interface field appears.
In this case select the logic expansion interface address where the object to control is located.



6. The other parameters can be found in the “Selected Item Properties” area. They differ depending on the selected object and will be explained in the following sections.
7. Once the page configuration/customisation operation has been completed, click the  pushbutton to go to the next page.

Time/Date/Temperature

If you include these objects in the Home Page, you will be able to display on the device the time and date, as well as the temperature measured by a specific zone. For the first two objects no configuration is required; however, for the temperature object:



1. Drag the Temperature object from the “Project items” area to the “Display” area, or double click the object.
2. Select the type of device the temperature will be read from.
3. Select the address of the device.

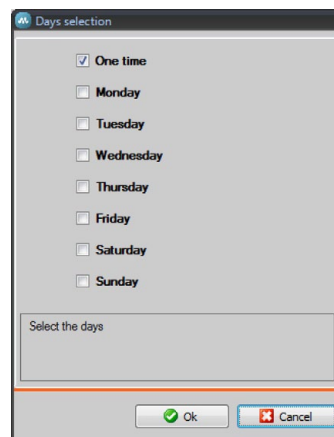
Alarm clock

The “Alarm clock” object (if previously included) gives the possibility of enabling/disabling the MyHOME_Screen alarm clock. If sound system is selected, it will be possible to set (from the device) one or more rooms of the sound system in which the alarm clock will be activated, and the source to switch on (stereo control/radio, etc.).




4. Alarm clock configuration:

- **Description:** enter a customised description of the Alarm clock object.
- **Type:** select the type of alarm clock (Beep or sound system).
- **Enabled:** select if to enable/disable the alarm clock.

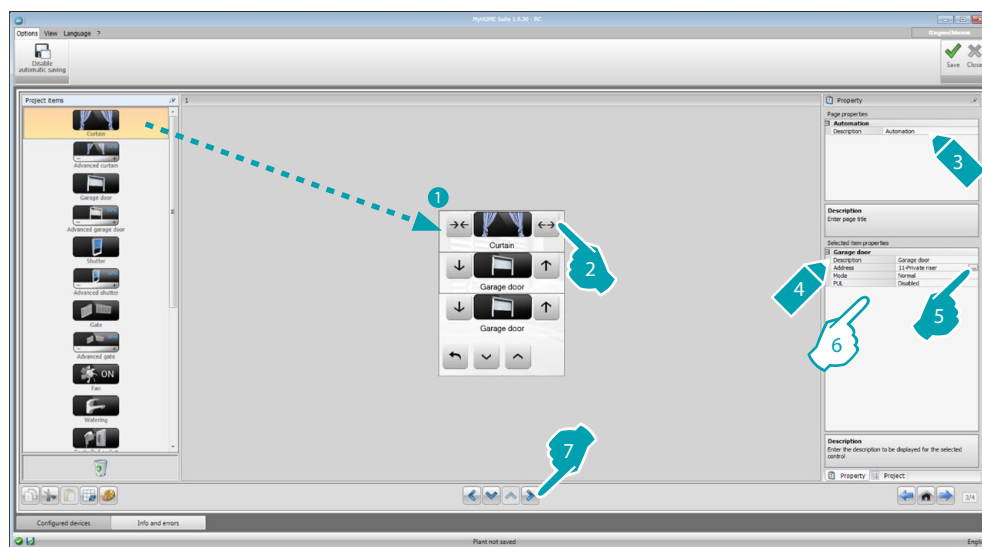


- **Days:** select the days during which the alarm clock will be active.
- **Hour:** select the hour when the alarm clock will activate.
- **Minutes:** select the minutes when the alarm clock will activate.

5. Once the page configuration/customisation operation has been completed, click the  pushbutton to go to the next page.

Automation

In this section it is possible to enter objects used to manage in a simple way all the automatisms of the home automation system, like rolling shutters, shutters, motorised curtains, controlled sockets, watering system, etc.



Advanced actuator control

All the automation commands have an advanced mode. This means that when an advanced actuator is installed, advanced functions will also be available: for example, the user will be able to display and change the opening percentage level using appropriate + and - icons.

6. Configure the object:

- **Mode:** For some types of automatisms (curtain, garage door, shutter and gate) the operating mode of the command must be configured:
 - Safe mode
Opening or closing is performed only while the corresponding key is pressed. When you release the key the movement will stop.
 - Normal mode
To start the opening or closing movement, touch the corresponding key. During the movement the icon changes, showing the Stop pushbutton, to indicate that the function is active. When you release the key the movement stops automatically. To stop the movement click Stop.
- **PUL:** select enabled if the actuator that you are configuring is configured physically or virtually as PUL.

For the Door lock command select the video door entry system address, or the address of the entrance panel associated to the system (if the device is wired on the video door entry system BUS); if the device is wired on the automation BUS, for the Door lock command the values A and PL must be entered.

Lighting

In this section you can include objects to switch a light or a group of lights ON or OFF, adjust their intensity, as well as set the lights to come on for set times.



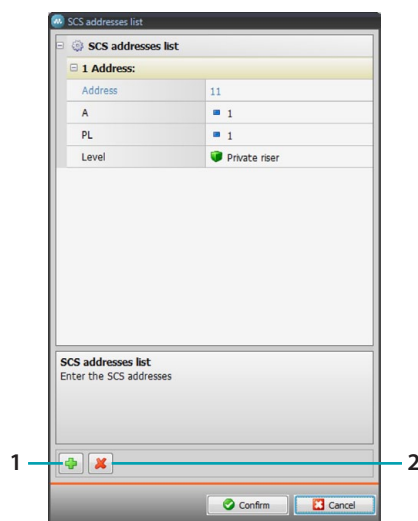
6. Configure the object:

Dimmer, Lamp

- **Dimmer type:** select the dimmer type (10 levels/100 levels).
- **Timed light on:** enter the ON time in seconds
- **Timed light off:** enter the OFF time in seconds
- **PUL:** select enabled if the actuator that you are configuring is configured physically or virtually as PUL.

Sound system

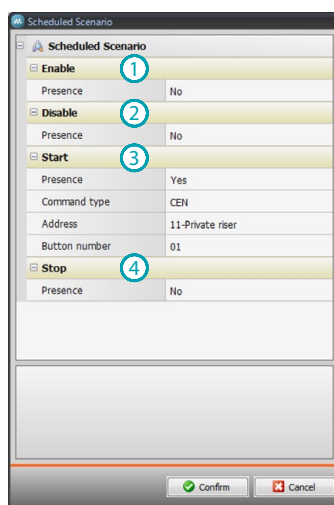


Programmed Scenario

It is possible to intervene on scenarios programmed in the scenario programmer.
The four possible actions are:

- Start
- Stop
- Enable
- Disable

The Enable (1) and Disable (2) commands, which can be configured in pair, are commands that give or remove the consensus to the programmer for the execution of the scenarios themselves. The Start (3) and Stop (4) commands force the start/stop of the scenarios.



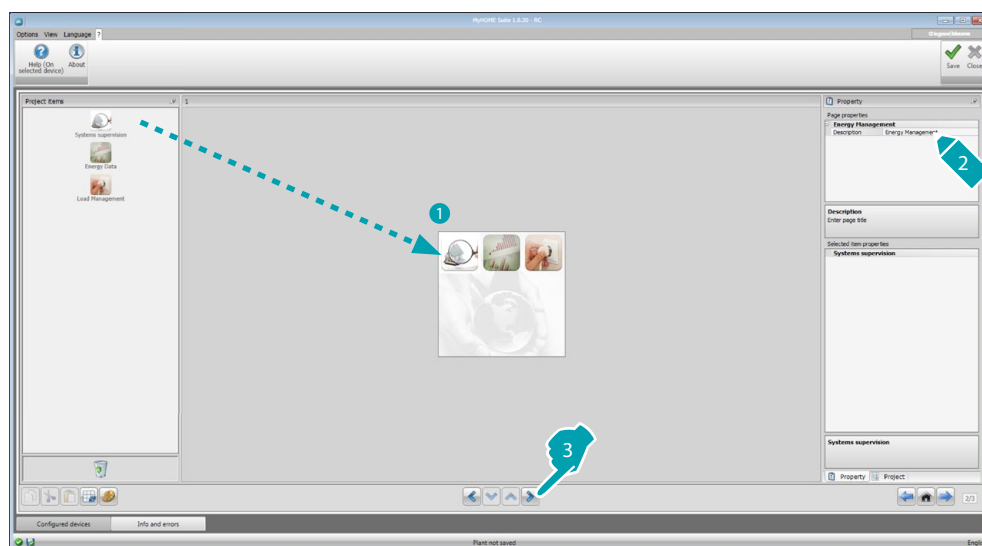
After selecting the presence the user must set:

- **Command type:** define if the command is a CEN or a CEN PLUS command
- **Address:** enter the address of the programmer
- **Button number:** enter the pushbutton number of the programmer.

Energy management

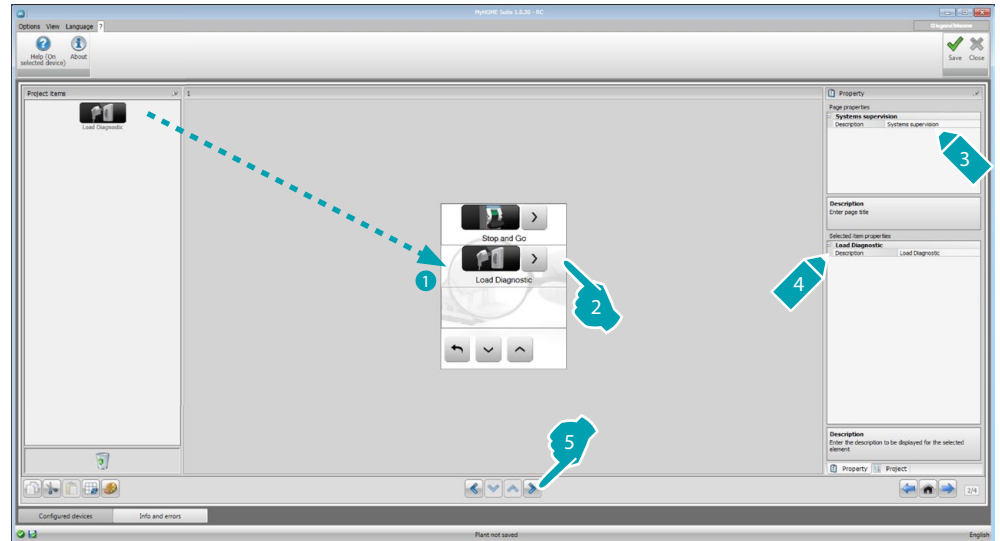
This section includes the following objects for the energy management: System supervision, Energy data, Load management.

- **System supervision**
This can be used to display and control STOP&GO devices, and check that the loads of the My Home system are working correctly.
- **Energy data.**
This can be used to monitor the consumptions and the production of energy for the following: electricity, gas, water, heating and cooling, hot water.
- **Load management**
Load management (with load management central unit)
 The load management central unit gives the possibility of controlling the power engaged to prevent the tripping of the meter, by excluding loads (like the oven, the washing machine, the microwave oven, etc.) following priorities set by the installer.
Load management (without load management central unit)
 If no load management central unit is installed in the system and advanced actuators are used, this application can be used to check the consumptions of the loads (like oven, washing machine, microwave oven, etc.).



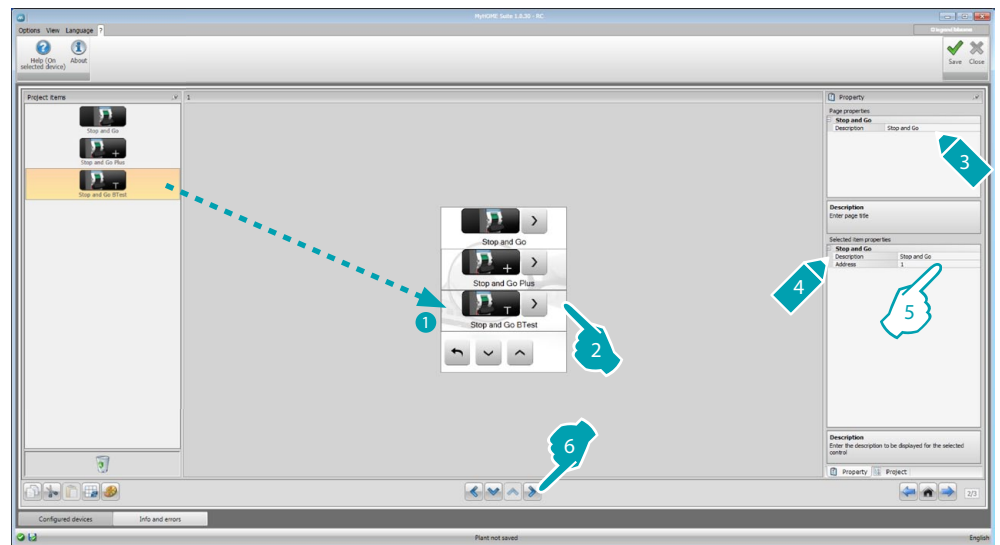
System supervision

This section can be used to configure the Stop&Go devices to display/control, and the loads for which you want to monitor the operation using MyHOME_Screen (advanced loads only).



Stop&Go

This section can be used to configure Stop&Go circuit breakers for the control of the automatic earth leakage relay reset function.



5. Configure the object:

- **Address:** Select the device address value.
The value can be between 1 and 127 and corresponds to the value of the configurators connected to the device configurator socket (e.g.: A1 = "1"; A2 = "2" and A3 = "5" corresponds to address 125).



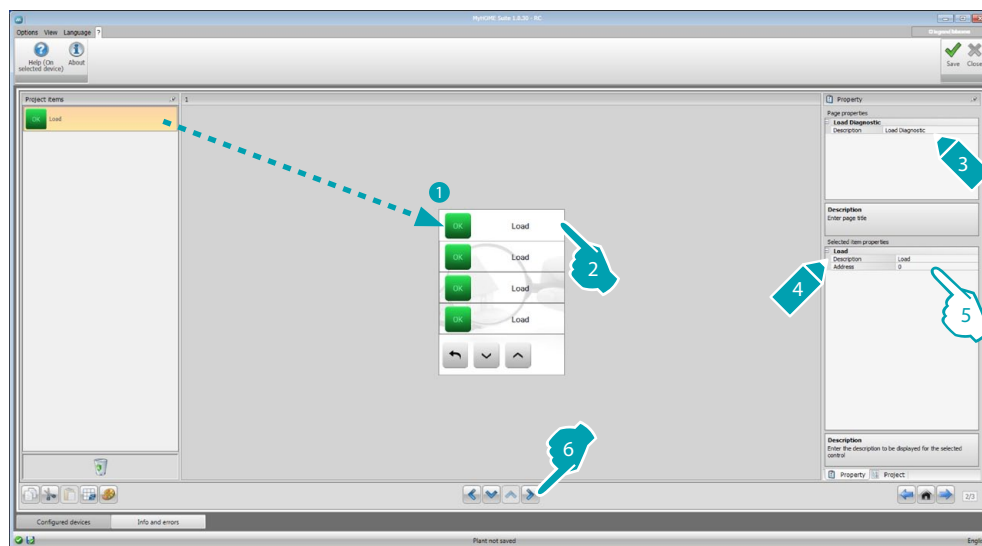

Load Diagnostic

In this section it is possible to include the objects for checking the correct operation of the loads by measuring the earth leakage current absorbed by the same.

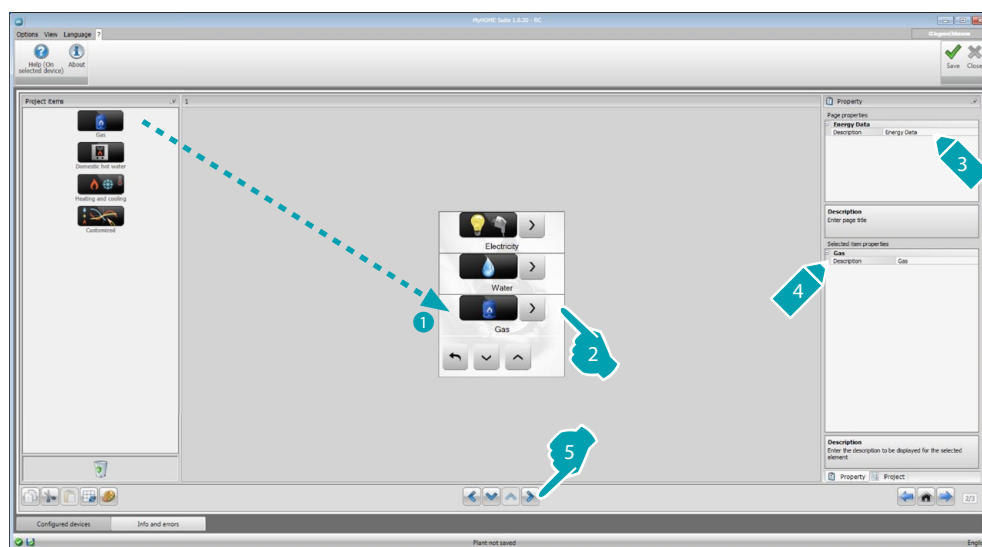

- **Address:** Select the device address value. The value can be between 1 and 63 and corresponds to the value of the configurators connected to the configurator socket of the device.

Energy data

This section can be used to configure the rows for Electricity, Gas, Water, Hot water and Heating/Cooling, setting the economic evaluation parameters, the type (consumption/production), and the alarm thresholds.

5. Configure the object:

- **Address:** select the meter address (1 - 127).
- **Economic evaluation:** enable or disable the [economic evaluation](#) of the measurement.
- **Type:** select the type of measurement between Consumption and Production.



If "Consumption measurement" or "Production measurement" are enabled, the corresponding tariffs must also be set (see "Currency setting").



The economic evaluation is an indicative data.

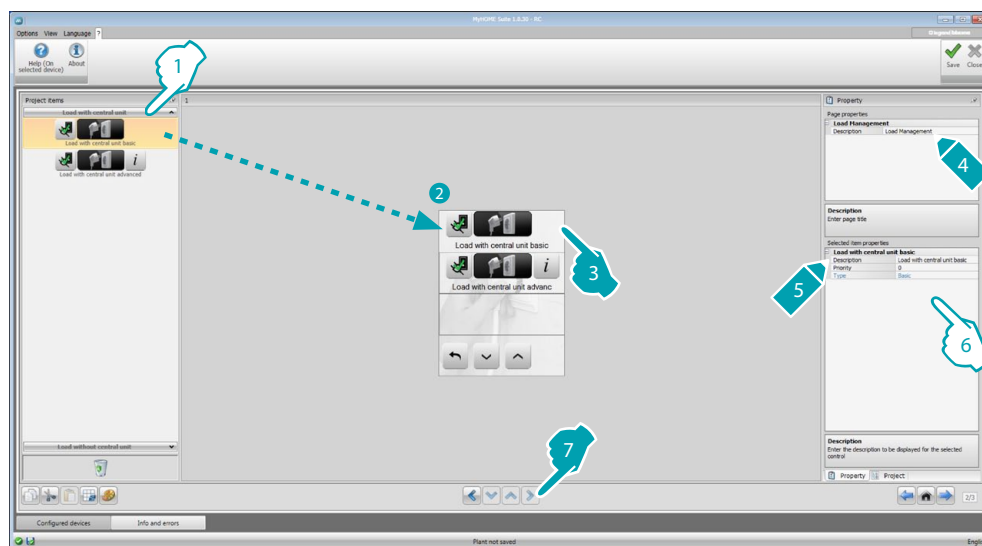


This manual only describes the displaying of electricity. The software manages all the items in the same way.

- **Threshold:** set 2 alarm thresholds, to displayed in MyHOME_Screen (electricity row only).

Load management (with load management central unit installed)

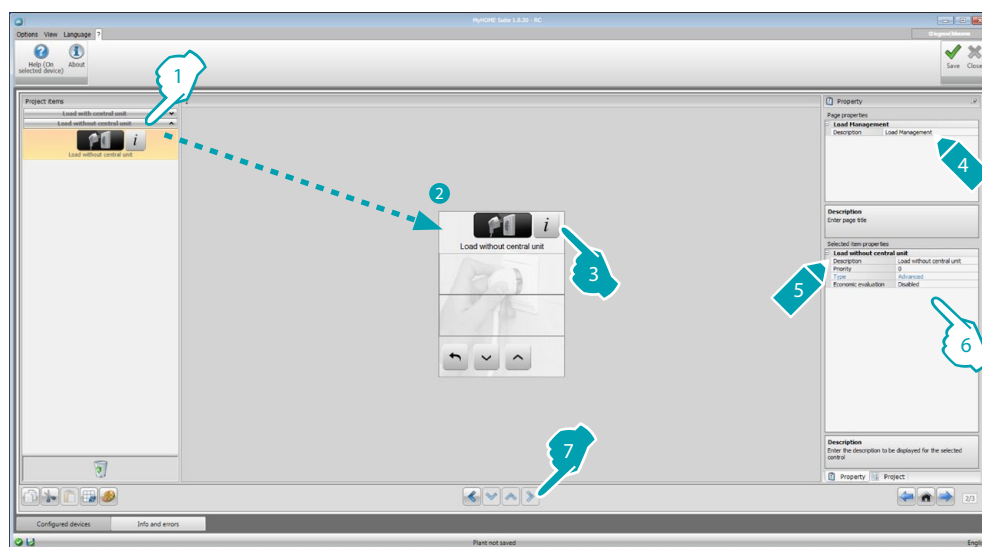
In this section you can insert the loads that will enable you (mode with central unit) to control the powers engaged and, by allocating priorities to the loads, avoid the tripping of the meter.

Load management (without load management central unit)

If no load management central unit is installed in the system and advanced actuators are used, this application can be used to check the consumptions of the loads (like oven, washing machine, microwave oven, etc.).

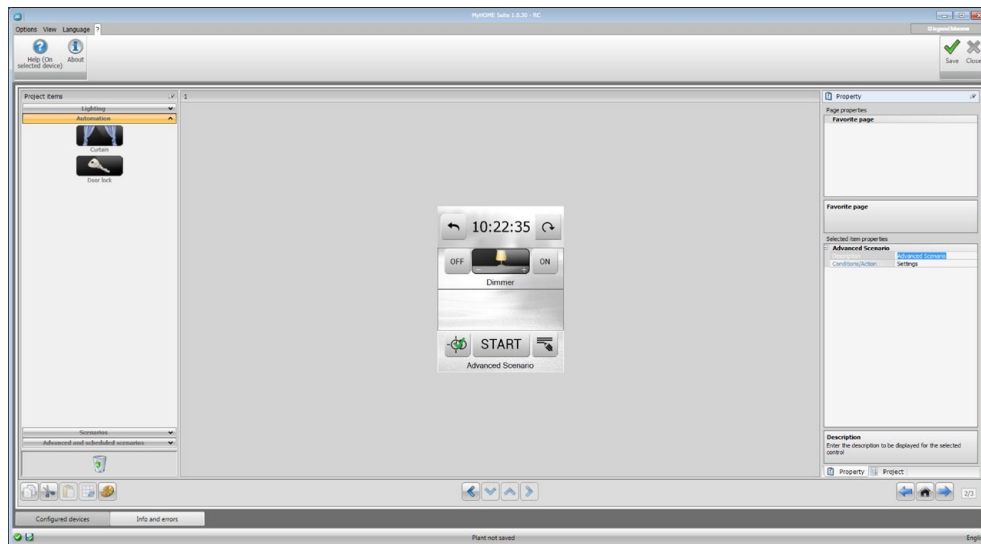

If set in the [Parameters](#) section as default page, the Favorites page is displayed after a certain period of time during which the device is in standby.

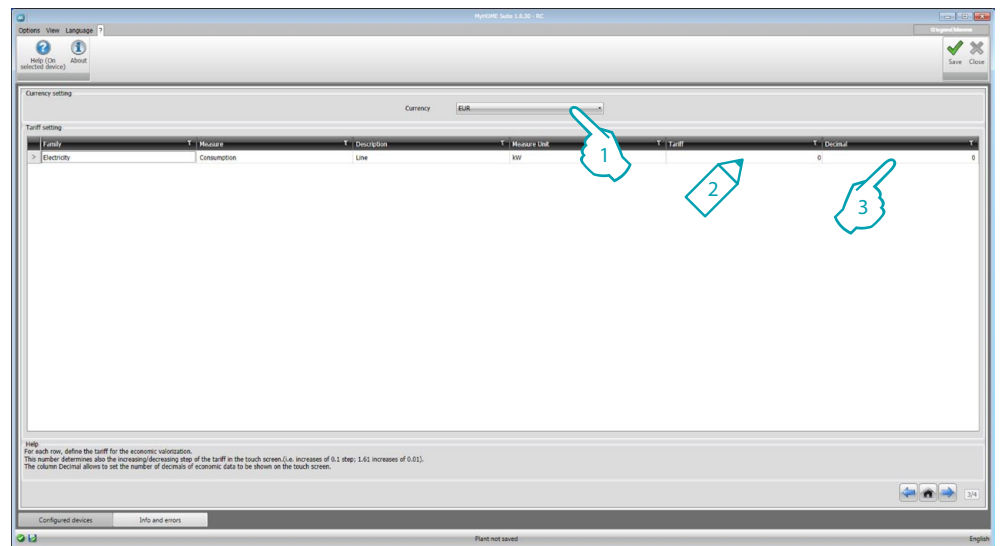



